Lesson 1

Students will be able to distinguish the equipment according to its function, recognise the equipment, understand its usefulness and usage.

Hand-held demolition equipment

Students will be able to distinguish manual demolition equipment by function, recognize equipment, and understand its usefulness and application.



Lesson 3

Hand-held firefighting equipment and extinguishing agents.

Students will be able to distinguish hand-held firefighting equipment by function and extinguishing agent, understand its usefulness and application.

FIREFIGHTING RESCUE EQUIPMENT



Learning objectives

Students will develop the ability to differentiate equipment based on its function, identify the equipment, comprehend its usefulness, and understand how to use it.



Follow the steps



Introduction

Welcome the students. Inform them that they will gain information about portable and various types of equipment and the usage of hydraulic equipment.



3 min.

Explain to the students details of the topic and why it is important. Use motivational techniques





Study

1. Begin the lesson with brainstorming and discussing reasons for using portable equipment by firefighters (enhancing the capabilities of firefighters, enabling them to operate more effectively and safely in various emergencies). Ask open-ended questions.



4 min.

2. Introduce hydraulic equipment. Present its parameters and usage.

3. Organise teamwork. Students recognize and name the introduced types of equipment. They can distinguish hydraulically powered equipment, they know its capabilities as well as cases and ways of its usage.





Group work

Divide the class into teams of three or four students. Next spread tools to each team, tell students to name the tool, and give specific information.

Teaching aids:

Real objects – examples of tools representing various types of equipment (e.g. spreaders, cylindrical spreaders, scissors, scissors-spreaders).

4. **Feedback and assessment.** After completing the task give the students information on their results and correct answers. Please provide feedback on how well they did the task. Use short comments such as "Well done!", "Good work!" or correct mistakes.






Practice

Welcome the students. Inform them that they will learn about the handy demolition equipment available to firefighters, its types and purpose.





Welcome the students. Inform them that they will You will learn about the hand-held extinguishing equipment operated by firefighters. You will learn about the types and purpose of the equipment.



Introduction

Welcome the students. Inform them that they will learn what is personal protective clothing (PPC), respiratory protection equipment, and personal alert safety system (PASS) they will wear during emergency responses.



2 min.

Explain to the students the details of the topic and why it is important. Use motivational techniques





Study

1. Begin the lesson with pair discussion practice based on general questions introducing students to the subject.



5 min.

Discussion questions:

- 1. Have you ever seen a firefighter in action? How did they look with all their gear on?
- 2. Do you think it's difficult for firefighters to put on all their gear in just 90 seconds? Why or why not?
- 3. How do you think wearing all that gear affects a firefighter's movement and agility?





Feedback round

After students' complete the activity, discuss the answers.

2. **Present** the video of firefighters discussing the components of firefighters' gear and how it protects them.

Make students to watch it carefully and remember/note down as much information as they can so that they are able to answer some questions later.
